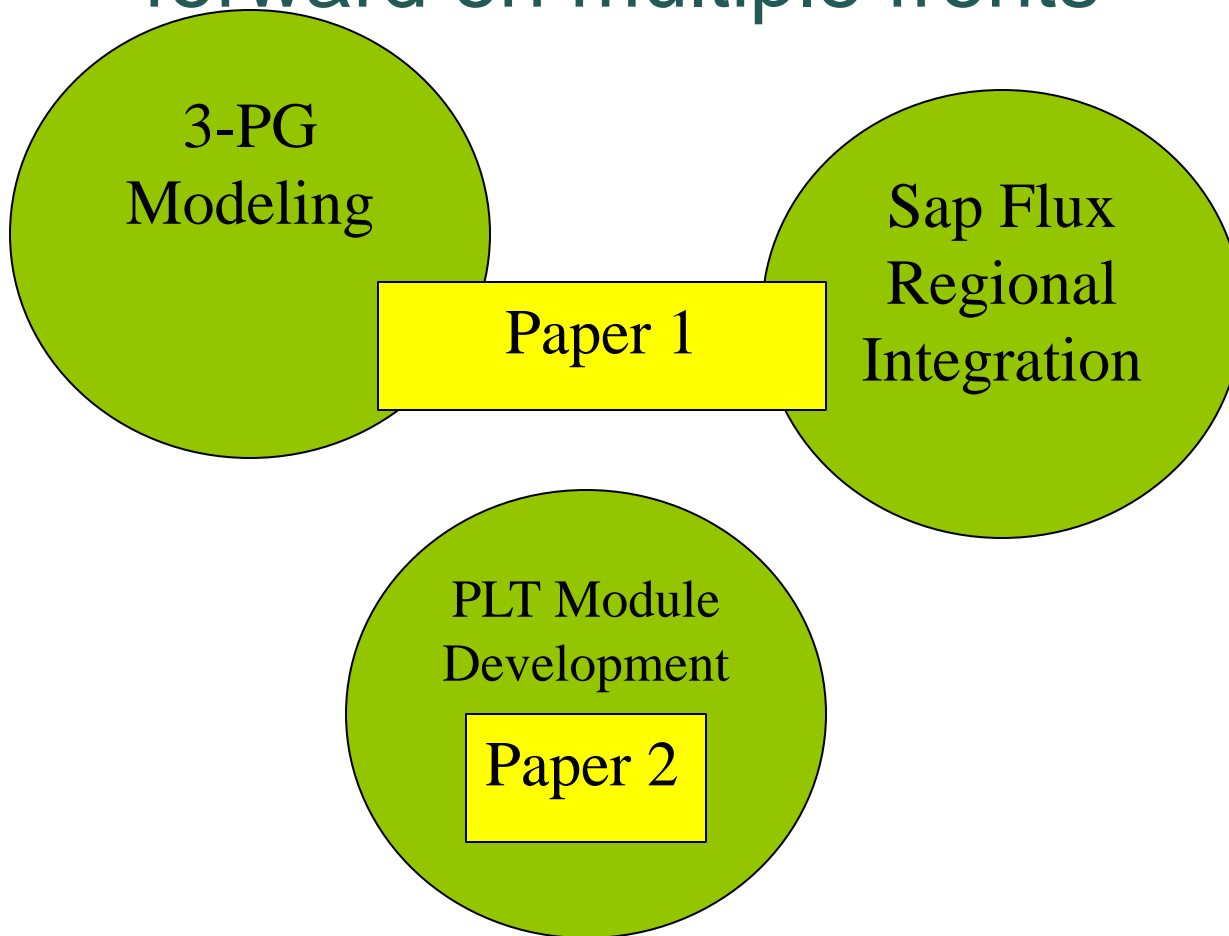

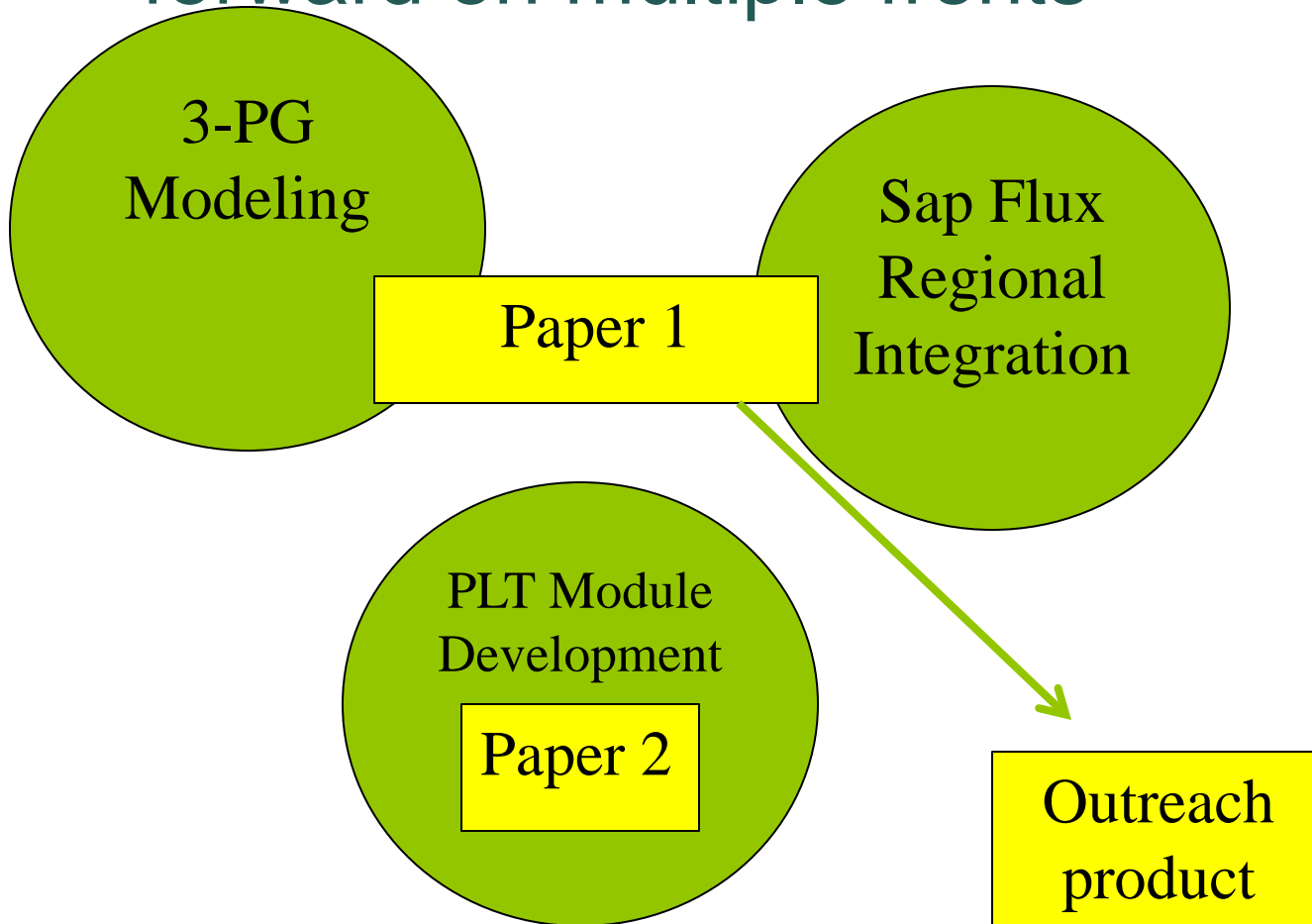


Integrative papers should provide another mechanism for moving forward on multiple fronts





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Integrative papers are a natural vehicle for progress

- Designated lead author or “champion”
- Established mechanism for collaboration
- Obvious benefits for participants
- Rallying point for integrative science
- In some cases will be a short leap to outreach products



Today's process

- A number of integrative paper topics have been established (see handout)
 - Opportunities for additional ones if needed

Authorship in Synthesis Activities

- Excerpt from PINEMAP guidelines
 - We will develop and support a culture of mutual respect and trust
 - We will strive for full attribution of credit
 - We will be equitable in our dealings with each other
 - We will foster an environment conducive to intellectual stimulation and growth for all those involved in the project



Authorship

- Excerpt from PINEMAP guidelines (cont.)
 - Discussions and decisions regarding authorship and author order of publications resulting from PINEMAP collaborations should occur **early in the collaboration process**. When in doubt about whether to offer authorship to a collaborator, **participants should err on the side of inclusion**. Authorship can always be declined if a participant feels they have not contributed sufficiently to merit authorship.
 - coop data guidelines
- Don't forget Tier I & II calculations, soils, climate data
- Graduate student projects must be protected



Authorship

- Everyone who “signs on” with interest in authorship should be included in initial discussions
- Discussions today or in early phases of communication should reach consensus regarding what contributions merit authorship
